SUMMARY OF TRENDS 2015 against 2014**

The population continues to show positive growth. This is supported by the ratio of juveniles: adult females in the population being greater than 1.

Another positive trend is that overall mortality is lower than the previous year. The Adult Sex ratio (number adult males: adult females) is within the normal range for Chacma baboons (*Papio ursinus*) indicating a healthy male population.
